Deaf Center Report In

The report of a feasibility study of a Comprehensive Community Center for the Deaf was completed and turned over to Walter D. Talbot, Superintendent, Utah State Board of Education on December 1st, according to Robert Sanderson, chairman of the committee for the study.

Members of the committee making the report were: Harvey Hirschi, Administrator, DVR; J. J. Campbell, Deputy Supt. State Board of Education; Charles C. Schmitt, Facilities Coordinator, DVR. Deaf members of the committee were: Lloyd Perkins, Mrs. Dora Laramie, Ned Wheeler, and David Mortensen.

Deaf people will be interested in knowing that there are NO more free teleprinters available from Rehabilitation. All usable machines have been given out. Urgent efforts are being made to find TTYs for deaf people who need them.

Those people who have two or more machines that they were saving for parts should consider selling them or giving them to others who do not have any. Machines that were loaned or given out by Rehab cannot be sold, however, if one bought a machine from the Ward for the Deaf or someone else then that machine can be sold.

Machines can be donated to Rehabilitation and those that are donated will be overhauled and donated to a deaf person who needs them. No TTYs can be or should be given out to hearing people when there are deaf people who need them.

UAD Exec. Meeting

Held July 2, 1975 at the home of Robert Sanderson in Roy, all executive officers were present with the exception of Dennis Platt who came in later.

The treasurer reported a preliminary figure of \$1,700.74 for convention expenses, and a "profit" of \$107.31 with some bills yet to be paid and some minor collections yet to come in.

The 1975-1976 budget was discussed but not finalized pending consultations between the president and the treasurer concerning some projects.

The Telecommunications contract was presented by Robert Sanderson, providing a payment of \$13,325.00. The UAD will hire and train a deaf TTY repairman. The officers voted in favor of hiring Norman Williams, at a salary of \$725.00 per month plus the usual fringe benefits.

The contract with the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation and its understandings were approved.



UAD Exec. Meeting

Held on September 29, 1975, the executive board met at the home of Dennis Platt in Ogden.

The State Fair booth came up for discussion. Cost of the booth and day passes for personnel came to \$220.00, while the sale of candy, \$135.00, reduced the net costs to \$85.00. It was suggested that a chairman be selected soon and a training session be set up for booth helpers.

The 1975-1976 budget was roughed out and a budget of \$15,200 (including the Telecommunications Project) was approved for submission to the board.

The executive officers unanimously voted to support the intent and concept of the editorial in the June 1975 issue of the UAD Bulletin, based on the Utah State Board of Education policy which specifically states that children shall not be separated socially at the high school level.

A detailed explanation of the Telecommunications Project was given by Robert Sanderson.

It was reported UAD is now identified on the State Employees Area Charitable Fund Drive as one of the non-profit organizations approved by the Utah State Charitable Fund Board.

The matter of federal tax exemption under 501-C-3 of the IRS Code was brought up. Some checking out will be done to clarify the status on this matter.

UAD Board Meeting

Held on November 2, 1975, the board convened with all members present, at the Education Building in Salt Lake City.

Gene Stewart and George Wilding, who were absent when the board members took the oath of office during the convention, took the oath at this meeting.

The UAD Telecommunications Project financing was explained to the board by Jerry Taylor and Robert Sanderson. The board formally approved the action of executive officers in requesting, securing and implementing the contract with the Division of Rehabilitation.

The board asked to follow up and secure more information on sponsoring Junior NAD members from USD on a trip to the Junior NAD convention at the North Carolina School for the Deaf in June.

After some discussion it was decided that in specific hardship cases, the USD could apply for funds to pay for hearing aid repairs.

A request for a new cubmaster from the deaf community, to work with approximately 25 cub scouts at USD, was referred to the executive officers for action.

It was decided that the NAD delegate be elected during the UAD convention, one year in advance of the NAD convention.

The treasurer report showed, as of November 1, receipts of \$69.04 and expenses of \$461.50, with a balance on hand of \$4,179.09. This report does not include the Telecommunications Project.

A letter from Saul Moss in response to the convention resolution asking for information on an answering service in Wisconsin, was read to the board. At present Milwaukee has answering service on 8 hours' basis only. Financing has been through United Fund and the Milwaukee Hearing Society. Through the Lion's Club Mr. Moss is working on a plan to have 24 hours service.
