Services for Hearing Impaired Clients

The Division of Rehabilitation has moved quickly to comply with the Utah Board of Education directive as prepared by Dr. Vaughn Hall of the Board of Education staff.

The new arrangement is that counselors who were with the Services to the Deaf office are now placed under district supervisors. The supervisor will screen all incoming applicants so that everyone has a choice of counselors. There is a choice of a counselor who does not use sign language but uses speech as the mode of communication, and one who can communicate in any way desired by the client -- sign language, speech, writing notes and the like.

The following information is provided for those who in the future may wish to seek services:

Ogden area: District supervisor, Huck Adelt; Norman Roberts has been assigned to work under him at 856 24th St. Phone numbers remain the same.

North Salt Lake area: District supervisor, Dr. Michael McDonald; Gene Stewart works under him at the Utah Board of Education Building, 250 E. 5th S. Phone numbers remain the same.

Central Salt Lake area: District supervisor, Kent Berg; Jim Hilber has been assigned to work under him at 638 Wilmington (about one block south and a half block west of 21st S. and 7th E.). Phone number is 533-5975.

Provo area: District supervisor, Mel Clark; Jack White is under him at the same office in Provo and can be reached at the same phone numbers.

Dr. Robert Sanderson will continue to coordinate all deaf unit activities to be sure that every deaf and severely hard of hearing people receive equal treatment, regardless of their educational philosophy.

The implementation is proceeding rapidly and should be completed by the time the Utah Board of Education convenes for its August meeting.

Register to Vote

All citizens, including the hearing impaired, are urged to register at their local voting district offices on August 1, 12 and 22. People who have moved to another county or moved into a different voting district need to register again. Registration is also

After the primary election, registration with local voting districts are on October 14, 17 and 31.
