Legislative Audit at the Utah Schools for the Deaf and the Blind: The legislative auditor's office has chosen USDB for an audit of its school operations. The team has turned up some money-losing practices, such as overstaffing in the cafeterias, charging less than actual cost of educating and housing out-of-state students, not making use of public transportation for day students. The USDB administration has taken steps to take care of these details so that their operations will be economically more efficient.
