Driver's License of Deaf Persons to be Noted

Beginning January 1, hearing-impaired persons applying for driver's license will have a note made on it of their disability.

A certification form, available from the Drivers' License Bureau, is to be filled out by a doctor and submitted to the bureau.

This will prevent problems when a deaf or hard-of-hearing person is stopped, or is injured in an accident. Police officers will see the note on the license and take appropriate action.

Kenneth Merrill, who acted on behalf of the Salt Lake Division #56 of the National Fraternal Society of the Deaf, brought up the matter with the Bureau.
