Toll Free Line to Governor's Office Dropped

As of July 1, the toll free Hotline to the Governor's Office was discontinued. Free to all callers, both hearing and deaf, it had cost the office \$700 per month to maintain.

Calls to the Governor's Office can still be accepted, but for out of town calls, they will be treated as long distance calls. That means callers will be billed for the calls by Mountain Bell.

The Governor's Office maintains a TTY for the convenience of hearing impaired callers who also have TTYs.

United Way of Northern Utah Accepts UAD

Announcement is made by United Way of Northern Utah (which includes North Davis, Weber and Morgan Counties) that the Utah Association for the Deaf has been accepted as an agency-designate.

UAD will receive funds through the United Way of N.U. from people who make contributions to United Way and designate (choose) UAD to receive their contributions.

Beginning January 1982, funds received will pay for the services of an interpreter, to be located in Ogden. The amount of money contributed directly to UAD through United Way will determine how much interpreting service will be available.

UAD is a regular participating agency with the United Way of Greater Salt Lake Area. Funds apportioned to UAD has paid for two full time interpreters, filling an urgent need in the deaf community.

All deaf people, friends and relatives of deaf people are urged to make United Way contributions this fall and to mark UAD to receive their money.

UAD Membership Drive Underway

UAD board members Roy Cochran and Alden Broomhead have been selected to head the UAD membership drive for 1981-1983.

Women on Target Class Set Up for Ogden

For Weber County women, a Women on Target class has been set up at St. Benedict Medical Center, in the ACT conference room on the first level. The class is a personal effectiveness "self-help" where women learn to deal with problems by starting with oneself. Beth Ann Campbell is the instructor.

September 2 is the date of the first class, to run ten weeks on Wednesdays until November 4. Classes begin at 6:30 pm and are two hours long. It normally costs \$95.00; a grant makes it possible to offer this class to deaf women at \$16.50.

Write to the TV Networks

Do we enjoy the new closed captioned programming being broadcast on NBC, ABC and PBS? Is it worthwhile for those TV networks to continue with the closed captioned programs? Should they expand the captioned programmings? But...how are they supposed to know??? The TV networks want feedback from the captioned program viewers. We must write to the networks if we want more shows to be captioned.

You can simply tell each network how much you enjoy captioned programs. For instance, one viewer says that she enjoys the captioned programs so much that she almost couldn't dare to miss any captioned program. When there is none -- she'd turn off the TV until the next captioned show!

Please write to the TV networks. It is helpful if you write to your local TV stations, too.

TTY to Voice Call Service Exceeds Past Records

The Ogden Services to the Deaf office has been making TTY to voice calls at the request of deaf callers who have no other means of contacting hearing people. The number of calls in the past seven months of 1981 has totalled twice as many calls made in all of 1980.

Clients have complained that they are unable to get through to the Ogden Services to the Deaf office on the TTY. To ease this problem, Dr. Robert Sanderson, director of Services to the Deaf, is requesting all deaf callers who ask for TTY to voice service to use good judgement in asking for help with such calls of a non-emergency nature that they feel are necessary.
