Summary: UAD Board Meeting Minutes



November 10, 1981 at the Marriott Hotel, SLC: Present -- G. Stewart, J. Taylor, N. Williams, P. Green, D. Mortensen, D. Platt, A. Broomhead, R. Cochran. Absent -- B. Aldridge, J. Burnett, R. Sanderson. Visitors -- L. Wilkin, D. Samuelson, N. & E. Wheeler, K. & P. Burdett. Minutes of the September 23rd meeting accepted with correction... Louise Wilkin reported the Miss Deaf Utah pageant progressing well... the board approved the donation of \$50.00 savings bonds to the two runners up in the pageant... Installment payments on TTYs were approved by the board. The purchaser must pay 50% of the total price, and the balance in 6 months with no interest charged. If the purchaser fails to pay off the balance within the 6 month period, the UAD will retrieve the machine and no refund will be made. The UAD will reserve all rights as to whom these machines are to be sold. The purchaser is to be responsible for the buying of the Phonetype coupler... Rollin Jones gave a report on the UAD Achievement Award program; decision on the report was tabled until the next board meeting... Dave Mortensen reported on the progress of the Center for the Deaf... The board agreed to have UAD make a bid to host the 1986 NAD Convention in Salt Lake City... Ned Wheeler made a presentation regarding the Bulletin monthly happenings which the board had recently decided to omit after the December issue. The board called the motion back for reconsideration, and killed it (in effect, allowed the Bulletin monthly happenings to remain after the December issue).

Update on Closed Captioning

Although it has been announced that the ABC Captioned News would be broadcast in the early evening, Salt Lake City is not one of the target cities in the nation chosen to try out the new program. PBS Channels 7 and 11 will continue to broadcast the program at the usual times, 10:30 and 11:30 pm.

Special reports coming up on the ABC Captioned News include "They Were Never Excluded", November 24-27, about colonial mainstreaming on Martha's Vineyard; "On Being Deaf", an excerpt from "The Tom Cottle Show", on November 26, an interview between psychologist/sociologist Tom Cottle and Annette Posell, a deaf Caption Center staff member; and "Sex and Disabilities", December 1-11, about the disabled and their ability to achieve satisfactory sexual identity. In addition to these special reports, Monday nights will feature a new regular report, "Late Night Magazine".
