UAD Convention: Saturday

A business session at 9:00 am will start the day. Depending on how much business there is to be done, it will conclude an hour or two after a lunch break.

On Saturday afternoon, after the business session concludes, a workshop will be given by Mountain Bell.

Barbara Fenton, director of the Telecommunications Center for Disabled Customers (TCDC) at its headquarters in Denver, will be on hand with an interpreter to assist.

Ms. Fenton will explain about the services available for the deaf from Mountain Bell. Even if you think you know about or understand these services -- the 50% credit on intrastate toll calls, the toll free phone numbers, and others -- make it a point to be on hand to hear all she has to say. You may be able to help those deaf friends who were unable to come. And it will save you time and money to know about these services.

UAD Convention: Banquet Highlights

The name of the guest speaker for the banquet was not available at the time of publication. It is hoped that a prominent legislator will accept the invitation to speak about the Utah legislature and how to deal with it.

The UAD president, Dave Mortensen, will announce the recipient (there may be more than one) of the President's Award. A plaque will be presented to the individual who has given meritorious service to the Utah Association for the Deaf. This award, which has not been given in the last decade or more, is being re-established to honor people who go the extra mile.

The Golden Hand Award and the Employer of the Year Award will be announced by Kenneth Kinner, chairman of the Golden Hand committee. The Golden Hand Award will go to the individual who has given extraordinary service in terms of time and effort to the betterment of the welfare of the deaf in Utah. The Employer of the Year Award will go to the company that has shown a record of hiring the deaf and promoting the welfare of the deaf on its staff.

UAD Becomes Franchise Holder of VuPhone

UAD has obtained the franchise rights to sell VuPhone, a new telecommunication device, in the West. People who are interested in becoming an agent can contact Dr. Robert Sanderson at 533-5997 (TTY/voice:SLC) for more information.

The VuPhone sells for \$750 retail. There are options with the VuPhone; discounts may be available. The VuPhone has a memory which can hold messages for your calls.

Contributions of \$1.00 will entitle donors to a free chance in a drawing for a VuPhone to take place at the convention. Tickets are available from several key UAD people.

The association has M-15 and M-28 TTYs, the first at \$200.00 and the second at \$400.00 plus crating and shipping costs, available. TTY covers and tables are available at \$20.00 each.

National Crisis Center for the Deaf Opens

A new service offered at the University of Virginia Medical Center will allow TTY callers to dial a toll free number to get assistance for medical, police, fire or other emergencies. The phone number to call is 1-800-446-9876.

This service will be useful to deaf people living in communities where no TTY emergency assistance exists. Trained staff members will call the police, fire or rescue squads in the deaf person's community.

The project is financed by a grant from Jerry Falwell's "Old Time Gospel Hour"; no state funds are involved.
