United Way: "Give Generously!"

Although the United Way campaigns are under way in many parts of Utah, we cannot emphasize enough that if you haven't contributed yet -- do it! And contribute generously! The Utah Association for the Deaf receives money from the United Way of Great Salt Lake to fund two full time interpreters in the Salt Lake area, and will be starting to receive money from the United Way of Northern Utah to pay for the services of an interpreter. Many of you work; make your donation through your payroll deductions or in a lump sum, and make your money count -- designate UAD to receive your donation.

A T & T Petitions for Interstate Rate Discounts

On August 21, American Telegraph and Telephone petitioned with the Federal Communications Commission to allow interstate (state to state) calls. If this proposal is accepted, deaf callers will be eligible for reductions of 35% on daytime calls and 60% on evening calls.

This is A T & T contribution to the International Year of the Disabled Person.

Mountain Bell Offers TTY Listing in Telephone Directories

This year, those who wish to have "TDD" or "TDD/Voice" listed with their name and phone number can have it. There is a one-time charge of \$3.25 for this service. The deadline is November 1st.

Mountain Bell cautions deaf customers that this listing can cause problems. Dishonest persons who find this "TDD" listing will know deaf persons live at this address and may use this as a good chance to burglarize the home. For this reason, it is suggested that at the time the "TDD" is added, the address be dropped.

Pranksters can also use the "TDD" phone number to call and make annoying voice calls when the number accepts only TDD calls.

Before you decide to make this change to add "TDD" or "TDD/Voice" to your listing, consider these problems carefully.

USD and ISD Host October Workshop

Sponsored by the Kellogg Foundation and the Utah Parent Coalition, a workshop will be held October 9-10. The workshop involves parents of deaf children, professionals and deaf adults who will work together to achieve a continuous, positive working relationship.

Both the Utah and the Idaho Schools for the Deaf are hosts of this workshop, to be held at the Ogden campus, 846 20th. Lodging is available for those living some distance from the school. A \$5.00 registration fee pays for the three meals during the workshop.

A deadline of September 25 is on all flyers, but phone reservations will be accepted up to and including Thursday, October 1. Call USD at 399-9631 to make sure you can participate in this worthwhile workshop.

The workshop starts at 4:00 pm Friday with a sign-in and concludes at 5:00 pm Saturday. Individual displays will be located in the Multipurpose Room on Saturday.

Update on Closed Captioning

+++ Telecaption adapters and TVs are among the few products approved for Sears' Christmas Deferred Payment Plan. On this plan, purchases made between September and December will not be billed until February 1982. Those buying closed captioned TV sets during the Early Shoppers period (September 11 and October 19) can save \$53 from the regular price of \$529.95.

+++ ABC now carries closed captions for its "Monday Night Football." The system provides basic game information, such as down and yards to go, time outs remaining, scoring summaries, penalties and change of possession. It is hoped that special sporting events, such as the World Series, will be captioned by National Captioning Institute.

+++ "The Jeffersons," a CBS network show for the past six years, is now closed captioned and being sold to local TV stations. It is the first network show to be sold to stations with closed captioning. In many cities, "The Jeffersons" will be shown five days a week, with 159 half-hour episodes to be shown during the fall and winter.

+++ The WGBH Caption Center in Boston has produced a permanent reference collection of comprehensive and pertinent consumer-related information for schools, libraries, vocational rehabilitation programs and other organizations serving deaf Americans.

Resource materials derived from "Captioned Consumer," a special feature on Captioned ABC News have been updated and gathered into "Captioned Consumer Skills," a series of 15 videocassettes, available for national distribution on a "free rent" basis (borrower pays only return 4th class postage) through the Captioned Films for the Deaf in Indianapolis.

Topics include home safety instruction, personal health care information, financial guidance, shopping tips and the accessibility of legal and social agencies' assistance.

+++ The WGBH Caption Center in Los Angeles is now captioning M*A*S*H as part of the CBS West Coast marketing test of teletext. Other programs currently broadcast with captions include "Lou Grant," "Dallas," "House Calls," "Magnum, P.I.," and the "Dukes of Hazzard."

Currently about a dozen teletext decoders are in use in the Los Angeles area. It is estimated that by the end of the summer, about 100 teletext decoders will be in use. CBS is placing them in a wide variety of public and private places where viewer reaction can be studied and evaluated.

UAD Hires New Interpreter

Beginning October 1, Wilma Powell will work as an interpreter under the UAD interpreter program. Wilma is a daughter of Clem and Edna Sevy, SLC, and holds a professional certification with the Utah Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf.

New Prizes to be Given in Creative Contest

"World Around You," a national news magazine for hearing impaired young people, will offer two new contest prizes for winners of the 1982 Creative Contest. A Schwinn 10-speed bicycle will go to the contest's grand prize winner, and a pair of Chicago roller skates will go to the runner-up.

All hearing impaired students 18 or under are eligible to enter the Creative Contest. The contest has four categories: fiction, non-fiction, poetry and drawing/art. Gallaudet Pre-College Programs, which is the primary sponsor, will continue to offer a \$50 prize to students in each contest category.

The theme is "Deafness." The approach may be physiological, social, personal or philosophical, but must focus on some aspect of deafness or hearing impairment. Only entries in the writing categories -- fiction, non-fiction and poetry -- will be eligible for the grand prizes.
