Summary: UAD Board Meeting Minutes

August 5, 1981 at State Office of Education, SLC: All board members present except Norman Williams...Resignation of John Burr, UAD interpreter, effective August 31, accepted...Positions of two part time interpreters eliminated, and a full time position established...Job opening of full time interpreter to be advertised in UAD Bulletin and through URID beginning August 25, with deadline of September 15 for applications; interviews from September 16 to 30 with October 1 as the beginning date for the job...Bulletin editor's recommendation to raise Bulletin advertising rates accepted...Board minutes to be summarized by the editor and included in the Bulletin, and copies of the summary to be sent to UAD members who are not Bulletin subscribers..."Monthly Happenings" column to be eliminated by January 1982 and events announced by organizations to be advertised at a cost of \$1.00 per line...Bulletin postage report to be given at the next board meeting...A Center for the Deaf organizational meeting to be set up before Dr. Sanderson leaves for Washington, DC...Brief report on Vu Phone given -- ten sold, plus ten more on order; five are spoken for.

Position of Full Time UAD Interpreter Open

The Utah Association for the Deaf is seeking applicants for the position of a full time interpreter in Salt Lake City. The salary and fringe benefits are provided for by an allocation from the United Way of Greater Salt Lake.

Changes in the Services to the Deaf Office

In the absence of Dr. Robert Sanderson, coordinator of Services to the Deaf Office who is on a ten month leave of absence in Washington, DC, Gene Stewart has temporarily assumed duties. He also acts as liaison officer between Utah Rehabilitation and the Utah Association for the Deaf.

Norman Roberts, counselor at the Ogden Services to the Deaf Office, has handed in his resignation. He will begin his duties as coordinator of services to the handicapped at Brigham Young University in Provo. At the time of publication, a replacement for Norman had not yet been announced.

United Way Kicks Off 1981 Campaign

In September, United Way in various areas of Utah will kick off its 1981 campaign with special programs. The Utah Association for the Deaf is an agency of the UW of Greater Salt Lake, and as of now, is an agency-designate of the UW of Northern Utah.

For the past few years the Salt Lake area has had the benefit of UAD interpreters. Deaf Taxpayers Now Can Call Congressmen on TTY

The US House of Representatives now have a TTY answering machine to allow hearing impaired citizens to contact members of the Congress. Messages will be taken by an operator and transmitted to the congressman you want to contact. A reply will be transmitted over the TTY.

Congressman Paul Findley, R-Ill has been a long standing supporter of the interests of the deaf, introducing legislation in the past three Congresses to allow tax credits for the purchase and use of telecommunications devices for the hearing impaired. Mr. Findley said that the TTY "insures...our deaf population will truly be heard".
