Procedure for Claiming Discount on Toll Calls Explained

Now that interstate (from state to state) as well as intrastate (within one's state only) calls are discounted for certified customers of Mountain Bell, an explanation of the procedure to claim the discount is in order.

Pay your telephone bill as usual, either by mail or in person. Take your toll call sheet that shows all the long distance calls you made, and mark those that you made by TTY. Write your name, address and city on it, and mail it to Mountain Bell TCDC (Telecommunications Center for Disabled Customers), PO Box 960, Denver, CO 80201. The Center will process your claim and send you a card showing how much credit will be given on your next phone bill.

If you are not certified to claim the discount, get a certification form from any Service to the Deaf office at the Rehabilitation Service, and send it to Mountain Bell at the above address given.

Mountain Bell has announced that Alaska, Hawaii, U.S. Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico are now included in the discount for interstate calls.

Center for the Deaf Plans Move Forward
