Two New UAD Interpreters Hired

Lucy Greenwood, UAD interpreter, has been given a leave of absence for one year. Taking her place as a temporary replacement is Mark Welsh. Mark is a son of Robert & Lorraine Welsh of Provo, and carries a background of association with the deaf: work with the deaf while on a LDS mission in Albuquerque, NM, and interpreting at UTC-Provo and U of U in SLC.

Before leaving for Virginia, she was hired as an interpreter for the Weber School District. While in Virginia, Becky took tests and obtained a Comprehensive Skills Certificate, and did freelance interpreting as well as interpreting for a school district there.

Center for the Deaf to Host Tours

In order to give deaf people and interested friends an opportunity to see the Center for the Deaf before remodelling starts, two tour dates have been set up.

On Saturday, May 8 and Saturday, June 5, both days from 10:00 am to 12:00 noon, the Center will be open for inspection. It is located at 40 N. Main, Midvale. Take the 72nd exit from the I-15 freeway, and wind your way southward -- the Center is located next to the Midvale city hall.

Take advantage of this opportunity, and see what the future home of your deaf organizations will be like. Once remodelling is begun, visitors cannot be allowed to enter the building. Remodelling will take place during the summer months, with a target date of the first week in September for completion.

The Center for the Deaf advisory committee has been meeting to set up priorities on various phases of remodelling.

Old Time Gospel Hour Offers Toll Free Counseling

The National Counseling Center for the Deaf is a program set up to aid deaf people with TTYs to obtain help on problems they may have. Their toll free number, 1-800-446-5000, can be dialed by anyone in the United States (except Hawaii, Alaska and Virginia), 24 hours a day.

The program was established by Dr. Jerry Falwell of the Old Time Gospel Hour seen on national TV. It is directed by Sue Wilmington, interpreter for the deaf on the same TV program.

If you suspect someone has swallowed a poison, they can tell you what to give the person and what to do. If you wonder how two different medications will react, they can tell you what the effect will be.

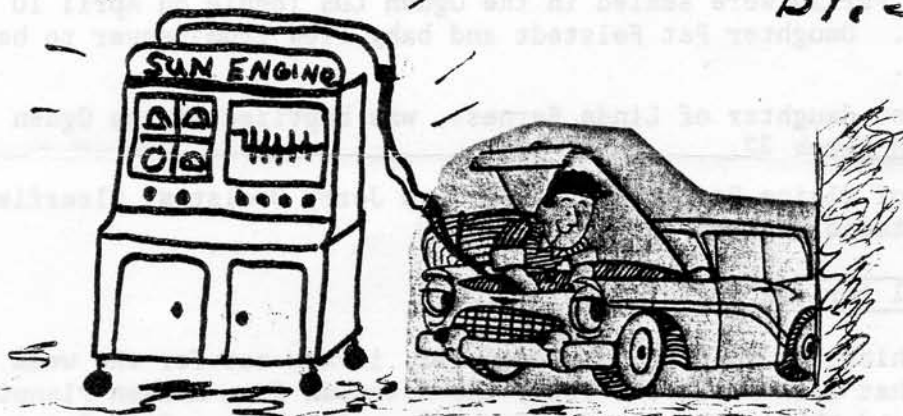
