Update on Closed Captioning

+++ NBC is withdrawing its participation in the National Captioning Institute closed captioning program, probably by March 15. The network says it is disappointed with the number of decoders sold to take advantage of closed captioning on TV. That means "Little House on the Prairie", "Sunday Night at the Movies", "Father Murphy", "This Old House", will no longer be closed captioned.

+++ During the ABC coverage of the Academy Awards on March 29, viewers with Tele-Caption decoders will be able to get closed captioning on this popular annual program. National Captioning Institute will be using its Real Time method, providing instant captioning of what is said.

+++ Two major Canadian networks, Canadian Broadcasting Corporation (CBC) and Canadian Television (CTV) Network, have signed with National Captioning Institute to provide closed captioning for programs on the two networks. It is hoped eventually to help the Canadian Captioning Development Agency set up its captioning center.

+++ Specials during the Easter season which will be closed captioned include "Perry Como Easter Special" on ABC, April 3. "Smurfs" and "Berenstain Bears" Easter Surprise" had been scheduled by NBC for April 5 and 10, respectively, but with the announcement that NBC will no longer provide closed captioning after March 15, it is not known if these two Easter specials will be closed captioned.

+++ Cable television is an area where closed captioning has not come. By the end of this calendar year, homes subscribing to Cable TV will be over 26 million. The National Captioning Institute needs your help in convincing the companies which provide programs for Cable TV that the hearing impaired do want them to caption their shows.
