Davis County Immunization Clinic to Begin in March at UCCD

Beginning on March 13, the Davis County Health Department will have its immunization clinic for school age children in Conference Room #1, and Women, Infants and Children's nutrition program in Conference Room #2 of the Utah Community Center for the Deaf in Bountiful. The clinic and the program will be held each Tuesday and Thursday from 1:00 to 5:00 pm.

The immunization program will include the usual "shots" to immunize children as required by law before attendance at school is permitted. This is a valuable public health program; when proper immunizations are given, the risk of deafness resulting from measles, whooping cough and other high fever diseases is markedly reduced.

The WIC nutrition program requires that individuals first register for determination of eligibility, at the Davis County Health Department at the Court House in Farmington (Room 3). An appointment is required; call 451-3348 (voice).

The Utah Community Center for the Deaf is pleased to cooperate in making its facility available for this important public health program.

Mountain Bell Discount Information Given

A new procedure allows hearing impaired customers of Mountain Bell to call on its toll free number and apply for the long distance discount. The number to call is 1-800-525-6028.

As a reminder, customers who qualify for the discount get 50% off on all long distance calls made within Utah. Out of state calls qualify for 60% off on daytime calls and 35% off on evening calls; no discount is made on night calls.

*** Ogden Standard Examiner carried in its "Remember When" column a mention that on January 18, 1964 -- twenty years ago -- William Cole, a retired compositor for the Ogden Standard Examiner for 50 years, died in the Printer's Union Hospital in Colorado Springs, CO. He was believed to be one of the oldest fulltime veterans in length of service for one newspaper among typographers in the American newspaper industry.

Update on Closed Captioning

*** "The Tale of Beatrix Potter," a two part series, will air March 25 and April 1 on Public Broadcasting Service. It tells the very private personal life of Beatrix Potter, who wrote and illustrated those delightful tales of charming rabbits around the turn of the century.

Update on Closed Captioning, continued

*** "The Stars Salute the U.S. Olympic Team" will be shown on NBC, March 5. This three hour special features the largest cast ever assembled for a television special. Major performers taking part include Bob Hope, Ella Fitzgerald, Wayne Newton, Brooke Shields, the Yale Glee Club, Kermit the Frog and many former U.S. Olympic gold medalists -- in all, 129 performers. Proctor and Gamble is funding the closed captioning of this program.

*** "Two by Forsyth," a one hour special scheduled for March 28 viewing, is being funded by Mobil Corporation for its Mobil Showcase Network Special.

*** "A Streetcar Named Desire" is being presented by ABC-TV on March 4. The production stars Ann-Margret and Treat Williams in Tennessee Williams' drama of a sexually repressed woman whose coquettish facade is invaded by her brutal brother in law. This drama is more closely based on Williams' original play than was the 1951 film version, which was adapted to conform to censorship requirements of the day.

*** National Captioning Institute marked its fifth year with highlights in 1983 marking progress in closed captioned television service for hearing impaired viewers. The company successfully completed its first year of operation without federal subsidy, fulfilling a promise to become self supporting within four years; formed a Corporate Advisory Council, whose five year goal is to have 60 percent of all national television programs closed captioned and 500,000 U.S. homes receiving captioned programs; created the NCI Caption Club which receives contributions, attracting matching funds to pay for closed captioning of selected programs; awarded several major contracts for captioning services; initiated decoder purchase program which put 80,000 decoders into homes and businesses.

John Ball, president of NCI, mentioned that just four years ago, 15 hours of closed captioned programming a week was available on ABC, NBC and PBS. Now, 40 hours a week, plus innumerable hours of videocassette movies, are available; cable and pay TV industry are offering closed captioned movies.
