Summary of UAD Board of Directors' Meeting Minutes

May 11, 1985 at the Utah Community Center for the Deaf: Present: R. Cochran, R. DeSpain, G. Laramie, S. O'Neal, D. Platt, G. Ross, J. Taylor, R. Sanderson, L. Perkins, D. Mortensen. Absent: A. Broomhead.

Eight visitors were present.

Minutes of the April 20, 1985 meeting were read and accepted as corrected.

It was stated that the interpreter policy was still incomplete and will be proposed later.

The board tabled a motion to cut the price of Model 28 TTYs until the business manager could present the board with figures.

With regard to privacy of TTY communications, it was decided that the UAD would develop a policy on confidentiality of TTY messages that flow through local, state and federal agencies, and to have a copy with each TTY or TDD that is sold to any agency.

Dr. Sanderson gave a verbal report on the rental monies with regard to the UCCD. His report was accepted. The board also directed the business manager to release the monies and report to Glen Ross, chairman of UCCD advisory board.

Summary of May 11, 1985 Board Meeting, continued

The board decided to move its office to the upper floor under protest. It also directed that the new rooms be ready before the move is made.

Copies of the revised constitution and bylaws were handed out to board members by D. Platt, chairman of the law committee.

Approval was given by the board to purchase the Microsoft File software as well as computer paper and mailing labels.

A brief report on the upcoming UAD convention was given by R. Cochran.

The board approved the purchase of one \$100 and two \$50 savings bonds to be given to the new 1985 Miss Deaf Utah and the two runners up.

Six visitors were present with a few more coming in at the end.

The board approved having the UAD-UW liaison officer, R. Sanderson, J. Hilber and a United Way representative sit together to discuss the rental monies and to have the liaison officer give a written report to the UAD board.

At this meeting, held immediately after the convention, officers were elected (see last month's Bulletin).

The board decided to have its monthly meetings on the first Saturday of each month. The first meeting will be held on June 29 instead of July 6 due to the July 4 holiday.

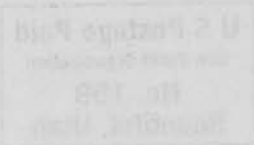
