Gallaudet College Press has come out with a new sign language publication, "Signs Across America," a book that gives a variety of unique and traditional signs found across the country. For example, the word 'picnic' is shown in 22 different ways. The text lists 130 words or concepts for which at least three and as many as 22 different signs (as in picnic) are recognized across the nation.

The 304 page paperback is on order, hopefully in time for last minute Christmas shopping. A copy of this book can be seen at the UAD business office at the Center for the Deaf. The book will sell for \$19.00.

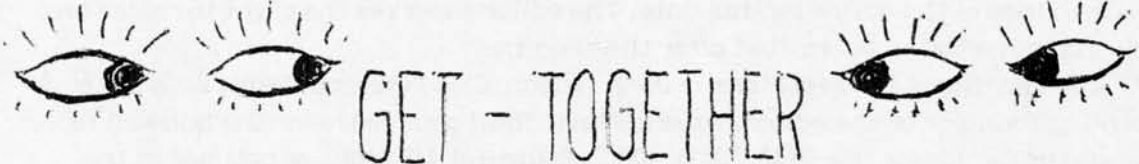
