Summary of UAD Board of Directors

Meeting Minutes

June 29, 1985 at the Utah Community Center for the Deaf: Present: R. Cochran, R. DeSpain, S. O'Neal, L. Perkins, D. Platt, R. Sanderson, J. Saunders, N. Sausedo, R. Simonsen, K. Walker, R. Welsh.

Visitors at the meeting numbered 14.

The minutes of May 11, 1985 meeting were accepted as corrected.

The minutes of the morning meeting of June 15, 1985 and the afternoon meeting of June 15, 1985 were accepted as read and corrected, respectively.

Letters from the NAD president, Larry Forestal, about the state schools and RID were passed out.

Minutes of the 31st UAD convention were also passed out; board members were asked to check for errors and report them to the secretary.

Glen Sparr was not present for the swearing in as UAD trustee.

R. Sanderson passed out a report on the meeting with United Way of SLC, clarifying problems which were discussed during board meetings in the past. His report was accepted.

Concerning the agenda item to select a delegate for the NAD convention in 1986, it was pointed out that the UAD was to wait until the combo ticket price was decided by the 1986 NAD convention coordinators.

Minutes of June 29 Meeting, continued

It was moved to continue representation with the USD, and to have three liaison officers from the UAD; also, UAD will send a representative to the Institutional Council (the governing body of USD).

Representation on the UCCD advisory board will be made as soon as the UAD president has received an acceptance from the person selected for this responsibility. The name of the person selected will be announced at the next board meeting.

Dave Mortensen's request to purchase the UAD typewriter that he had been using as UAD president was approved. It is to be a cash sale.

Robert Sanderson, co-chairman of the 1986 NAD Convention committee, outlined some financial agreements with the NAD Home Office. UAD will get \$5.00 per registration; all other income will go to NAD. Copies of the contract between NAD and UAD were passed out to board members.

Valerie Platt was appointed interim bookkeeper upon resignation of Nancy Taylor. Valerie is to be paid \$100 a month while the UAD board of directors advertise the position and select a new bookkeeper. The deadline for applying for the position will be August 24 and selection will be announced at the September 7 meeting. It was noted that during the discussion of this matter, Dennis Platt abstained from discussion and voting.

It was announced that Kirk Walker will be chairman of UAD Friendship Day at Lagoon on July 27.

A motion to have a booth during the KLCY Neighborhood Fair on July 24 was tabled, then untabled later in the meeting. It was decided that the UAD officers would take charge of the UAD booth at the United Way tent.

It was decided that a dozen used binders for use by board members would be purchased from Mountain Bell for 25 cents each.

A legislative workshop will be held by UAD on November 9, with UAD president appointing a committee for this workshop.

The board moved to authorize, in addition to the president and the treasurer, vice president, secretary and chairman of the board for the purpose of signing checks and withdrawal slips, in case either or both the president and the treasurer are out of town or unable to sign. It was noted that two signatures would be required at all times

Minutes of UAD General Membership Meeting, April 20

April 20 at the Utah Community Center for the Deaf: There were 18 UAD members and 7 visitors present. Dennis Platt, vice president and chairman of the law committee, presided. He appointed Celia May Baldwin to be parliamentarian and Deborah DeSpain to take charge of the overhead projector.

Minutes of April 20 Meeting, continued

Summary of motions to amend the UAD Constitution and Bylaws is as follows (UAD members who would like the full minutes may contact the UAD secretary for a copy):

1. In the event that a trustee resigns from office, the Board of Directors will appoint a trustee to fill the vacancy; such a successor shall serve out the term. It was also stipulated that the Board of Directors cannot remove a trustee for any reason. It was moved to have this proposal take effect at the next convention.

2. In several places throughout the Constitution, when it spoke of active members, it added life members as well.

3. The president shall preside at all meetings of the Association except the Board of Directors meeting.

4. An additional duty was given to the vice president: to interpret (clarify) the Constitution and Bylaws during any meeting of the Association.

5. The duty of having charge of all publishing and advertising matters was taken from the secretary.

6. The duty of preparing the agenda for Board of Directors' meeting and seeing to that the proper people are present to give their reports at the Board of Directors' meeting was added to the other duties for chairman of the board.

7. A section stipulating that fees shall be paid at or prior to registration during conventions held biennially, was deleted as it does not apply any more.

8. A housekeeping proposal, to change from "members in all classes" to "Active or Associate member" was made to the bylaws.

9. A line which was mistakenly repeated in the order of business -- necrology -- item 6 -- was changed to "report of committees."

10. For the oath, the word "newly" was added before "elected officer" and "Board of Directors and Board of Trustees" added after "elected officer."

11. A motion was made to limit the number of terms that a board member can hold as president or vice president -- two consecutive terms of two years each.

12. A proposal to have the UAD pay NAD quota according to the number of paid active members as of December 31 was referred to the law committee.

13. Another referral to the law committee was made for a motion to have active and life members make proposals for changes to or deletions from the UAD Constitution and Bylaws, in writing, to the UAD vice president at least 60 days before the next general meeting. The law committee may make proposals for changes to or deletions from the UAD Constitution and Bylaws as they see fit.

Two questions were raised that will need to be researched: first, if the chairman of the board is absent, who presides at board of directors' meeting? and second, after proposals are made and passed, when is the effective date to begin following the proposals?

Former Utahn Fills Gallaudet Chair

Gene Petersen, a former Utahn who now lives in Indianapolis, IN, has been chosen to fill the Dr. Powrie V. Doctor Chair at Gallaudet College in Washington, DC. He will do research during his year long tenure.

Gene has been with Crossroads and with Goodwill in Indianapolis as a counselor to deaf clients. He recently completed a term with ADARA (American Deafness and Rehabilitation Association).

Warranty Card Needed for TDD Repairs

Some TDD companies require that your warranty registration card be sent in, so that it can be on file in case of future problems. In the case of Ultratec products, the agents send them off.

When a problem arises with a TDD, it is helpful to have the warranty card, which has the TDD serial number, with the TDD when bringing or sending it in. If you do not have your warranty card, check with the UAD business office to obtain the date of purchase for your TDD.

Jerry Westberg is an authorized Ultratec repairman for both in and out of warranty Ultratec TDDs. Jerry can also repair, in some cases, other TDDs that are out of warranty.

Model 28 TTYs Reduced

Update on Closed Captioning

(Programs listed below are offered with closed captioning. For exact date and time, check your local listing).

*** Disney Channel will feature "Pollyanna" with closed captions during the month of September.

*** "Pathways to Excellence," a new video program aimed at young adults of high school and college age, has been open captioned, thanks to Pacific Institute. It contains 18 segments for young adults and 4 segments for parents, teachers and counselors. Hearing impaired youth will now be able to view this program along with hearing peers.

*** The Emmy Awards to be shown on September 22 by ABC will be closed captioned.

*** Because advertising clients who close caption their commercials now number over 300, National Captioning Institute has established its third production facility to provide a one-stop, overnight service for commercials. Its two other facilities are located in Falls Church, VA and Hollywood, CA.

*** The classic comedy series, "The Honeymooners" has been closed captioned for hearing impaired viewers. The unprecedented cooperation of the cable, home video and syndication industries, as well as the private sector, prompted this move. The series will show weekly on SHOWTIME, beginning September 9th, and will be preceded by a special, "Jackie Gleason's Second Honeymoon," on August 19.

*** The San Francisco International Video Festival being held September 26 to October 2 will feature closed captioned exhibits and full accessibility for hearing impaired patrons. In addition, a San Francisco television station, KQED, will display segments of the Festival with closed captioning. Patrons will be able to purchase closed captioned 1/2" videos of selected art.

*** The Miss America Pageant will be televised with live closed captions when it airs on September 14, on NBC. Live closed captions will be created by a trained court reporter whose stenographic key strokes are translated into English text by a computer.

*** HBO will show "The Terminator" with closed captions. This futuristic movie is a box office smash, starring Arnold Schwarzenegger.

*** "ThunderCats," which consists of 65 half hour segments, will be distributed for viewing this fall.

*** "Bubba Until it Hurts" is a home videotape of an exercise program given by Bubba Smith. It is being made available by Continental Video.

*** September offerings by SHOWTIME include "The River Rat," "Best Defense," "Romancing the Stone," "Splash," and "Unfaithfully Yours." It will also offer two movies from the Faerie Tale Theatre -- "Puss in Boots" and "Cinderella"...THE MOVIE CHANNEL will offer "Footloose," "Never Say Never Again," and "Staying Alive." To be seen on both channels are "Once Upon a Time in America," "Tightrope," and "The Wild Life."

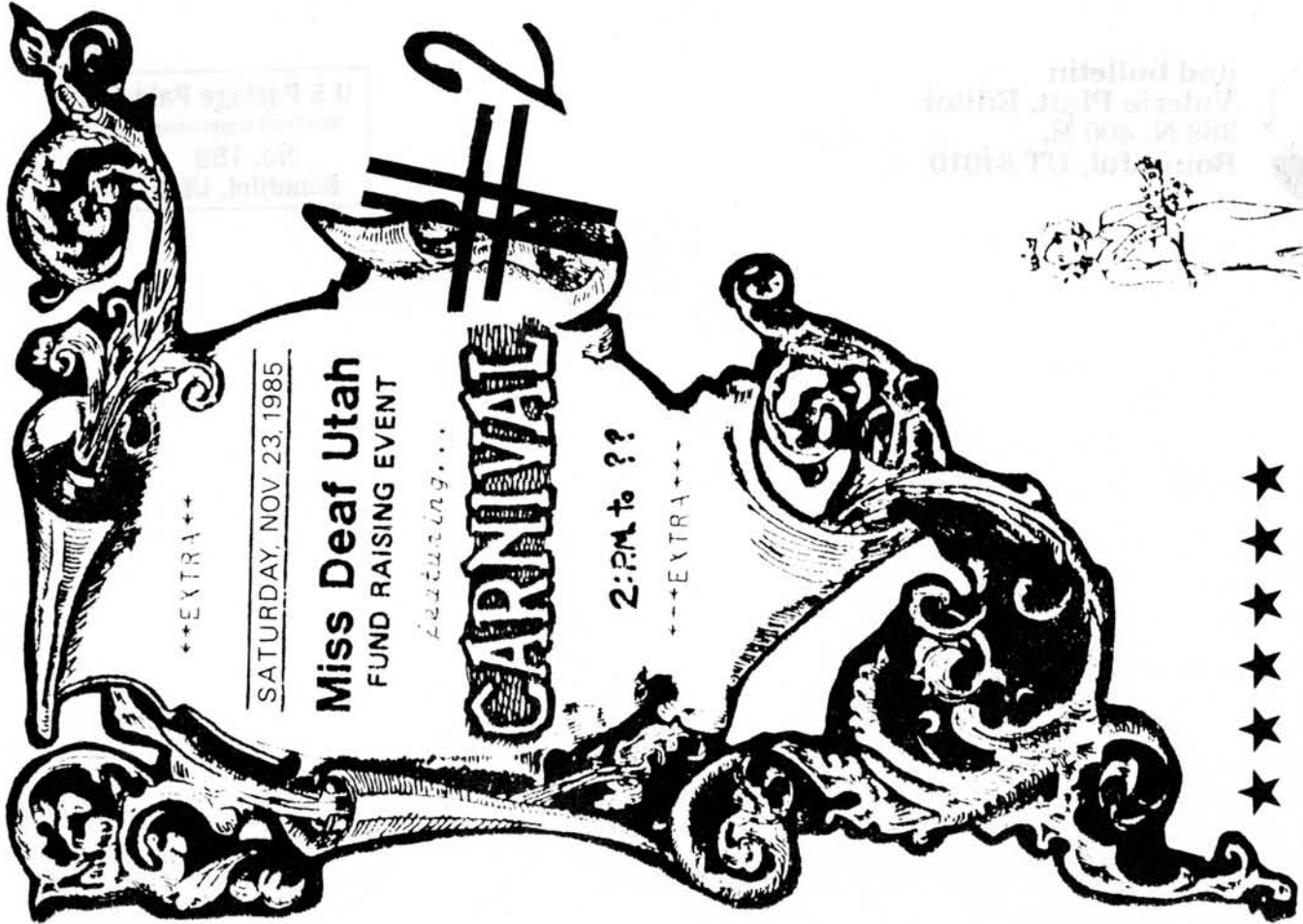
