## Update on Closed Captioning

(For dates and times of programs, check your local listings. Also, for updates on closed captioned programs, check your TV -- turn to Channel 4 ABC, and be sure the decoder is turned to C1 and TEXT)

\*\*\* **NBC's Meet the Press** has been closed captioned since mid-June. It is a half-hour program airing on Sunday afternoons in this area. The closed captioning will be through NCI real-time technology, which enables captioning to be transmitted on the screen seconds after the words are spoken.

\*\*\* Live closed captioning will be provided for late night news beginning September 15, in the Washington, DC area on WJLA-TV Channel 7. It airs at 11:00 pm nightly, Monday through Friday, in the DC area.

## Interpreter's Corner

Summer sign language classes are available throughout the Salt Lake valley. Kirk Walker teaches one at Utah Community Center for the Deaf; Annette Tull at Kearns High School, and Sue Bahleda at the Salt Lake Community College (formerly Utah Technical College). With two major workshops presented last May and June, the Utah Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf is preparing a certification workshop at the end of August. Certification sessions will be held September 19 and 26.

Certified interpreters have been interpreting in public settings, such as the recent Public Service Commission hearing in May when access to phone service by deaf people was discussed.

## Fall Dates Set for Interpreter Certification

The Utah Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf has set aside September 19 and 26 for certification of interpreters. Those who are interested in being evaluated for certification are strongly encouraged to attend the all-day workshop on August 29 (see August Happenings).

Those applying to be certified must be a member of the URID; the cost is \$10.00 and includes a year's subscription to the UAD Bulletin. A written test must also be taken; this is \$5.00.

The last step is the evaluation, which is \$15.00 for those applying for Associate I or II certification, and \$25.00 for Professional certification.

Call Annette Tull at 969-7712 (Bennion) or Pat Van De Graaff at 375-6479 (Provo) for an application form. This is an important step as appointments are set up for September 19 or 26 once the application form is sent back to them.
