Summary of Board Minutes

March 7, 1987 at the Utah Community Center for the Deaf. Present: D. Platt, R. Cochran, R. Walker, R. Welsh, P. Green, D. Mortensen, G. Laramie, N. Sausedo, M. Thurston, G. Gavros. R. Sanderson was excused. Eight visitors were present.

Minutes of February 7 meeting were read and approved with some corrections.

LaRue Ross, trustee, reported that the fourth quarterly financial report for 1986 was audited and found correct. The report was accepted.

Ronald Nelson, chairman of the UAD convention, recommended that the convention be held at the Excelsior Hotel in Provo on June 13. The recommendation was accepted. The board directed that a coupon for membership dues be printed in the April, May and June issues of the Bulletin.

Robert DeSpain updated the directors on the plans for the 1987 Miss Deaf Utah Pageant to be held in Salt Lake City on June 12.

Valerie Platt, business manager, explained the committee's choice of new CPA. The CPA firm of Crouch, Wood and Barber was accepted by the board.

Valerie Platt also gave information on the cost of gears and ball bearings for the Model 28 TTYs. The board directed the secretary to write to Beth Ann Campbell with the cost of gears and ball bearings.

Information on old TDDs which the UAD owns was given by Valerie Platt. The board directed that one of each model be kept as collector's items and the rest be given to the TTY Shop.

Roy Cochran gave information on the USD advisory council meeting which was held February 19th.

Roy Cochran also gave information on the Junior NAD camp.

Dave Mortensen reported that with SB 101 having passed in the legislature, a victory party would be held on the following Friday 13th. Other bills relating to deaf people and their outcome was also explained by Dave.

The board was informed that our request for grant monies from Title XX was turned down.

Dave Mortensen updated the board members on the interpreter program.

The Golden Hand Award was mentioned.

Copies of the Fishbowl report were passed out to board members.

Dennis Platt mentioned that any new proposals for UAD bylaws must be handed in before April 13th, 60 days before the UAD convention.

The board decided to review the possibility of having the general fund broken down into several funds (on paper) for reporting purposes. The board of trustees, treasurer and bookkeeper are to form a committee, and the bookkeeper is to be chairperson.

A picture frame is to be purchased for the NCI 1987 Caption Club certificate and hung in the UAD office.

New Scholarships Available to Deaf Students

For the 1987-1988 academic year, \$600 has been set aside by the Ned C. Wheeler Scholarship Foundation, formerly know as Utah Scholarship Foundation for the Deaf. The awards of \$200-300 will be given to deserving hearing impaired graduating high school senior or current college student. The number of awards will depend on the number of qualified candidates.

A 40 minute videotape, **Their Next Breath Could be Yours**, on the hows and whys of CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) is now available with captions and is also interpreted in sign language. It teaches people how to spot the signs and symptoms of a heart attack and the basic skills needed to perform CPR on adult victims.
