### **President's Message**

I'd like to share with you some of the important issues of interest that happened at the National Association of the Deaf Convention in Charleston, South Carolina during the week of July 3-9, 1988 while I was there as a representative of the Utah Association for the Deaf. At last count, there were approximately 1,800 persons registered at the convention. Utah had a count of 1,300 persons at its convention in 1986. These figures are for comparison purposes only, and not to say which convention had the most people. Let me start off with our Miss Deaf Utah, Celeste Trimble. Even though she has not included in the top ten contestants, she did win a prize, that of being the shortest contestant in the group at five feet and one inches tall. She said that the experience during the week was wonderful and very, very busy. She will remember this event the rest of her life. There were 34 contestants entered. Miss Deaf Illinois, Brandeis Schulthorpe won the coveted crown as Miss Deaf America for the next two years. Second Runner Up is Miss Deaf Virginia, Charity Reedy, and Miss Deaf Hawaii, Colleen Cidade, grabbed Third Runner Up. The whole pageant was wonderful and lovely to watch. Dr. Lawrence Newman was re-elected for President of the NAD for two more years. He was contested by T.J. O'Rourke. Paul Singleton of Washington DC won the Vice Presidential post by beating Mr. O'Rourke on second ballot. Dr. Roz Rosen copped the Secretary-Treasurer's post by a landslide. In our Region IV Caucuses, Leo Curtis was re-elected to Regional Representative for another four years. Our other representative, Ed Van Stigem has two more years to serve. He is from Montana. Some of the changes in the NAD bylaws that are of interest.

Increased state association representatives. For 20 to 499 members there is allowed 2 representatives. 500 to 749 members, 3 reps, 750 to 999 members, 4 reps, and over 1,000 members, 5 reps. This means that Utah can send two representatives to NAD Convention in Indianapolis in 1990.

California, District of Columbia, and New York Associations of the Deaf had 4 representatives each. Maryland and Massachusetts had 3 representatives each, with all other states having one or two, depending on membership in state associations. There were 70 representatives in the Council of Representatives, with another 15 from other groups that were also allowed representatives and could vote.

Passed by the Council of Representatives was a change in methods of voting for officers during conventions. Exact wording is "Voting for NAD officers and regional board members be carried out by ballot." This means that in future conventions, rather than having CR persons raising hands to vote for officers, etc., it will now be done by ballots. Rationale is that it is sometimes very sensitive to others to show a vote by a raising of hands, and this was brought up.

It was passed that the bylaws of the NAD be overhauled into more readable language. This doesn't mean that the bylaws will be written up in ASL or simplified, but lots of typographical errors and double working will be eliminated and the bylaws cleaned and then presented to the NAD Convention in 1990 at Indianapolis, Indiana for approval.

The Council of Representatives moved and passed a motion that called for a study of the branch office in Indianapolis and called for a phasing out of the office by transferring all work to the Home Office in Washington DC. The branch office would then be turned over to the Indiana Association for the Deaf for their use and maintaining. Rationale was that whatever grants the branch office was receiving were not being passed on to other state associations. And that some mandated ruling that branch offices be established in other regions was not being carried out and would not be feasible at this time. Some other bills were proposed during the convention and did not make it to the floor of the Council of Representatives for a vote, but will surely be up again in the next 24 months. These included a proposal to ....

The NAD should emphasize that COED (Commission on Education of the Deaf) recommendation on affirmative action include more deaf people be hired as teachers, deans, administrators, and counselors for elementary and secondary educational programs. Additionally, more deaf people should serve on boards that oversee the education and survival of schools for the deaf.

SIGN (Sign Instructors Guidance Network) motioned that all teachers of the deaf should be certified as interpreters for the deaf since most hearing-impaired students do not receive a good education due to the inability of teachers to communicate with them.

All teachers of the deaf should pass a SIGN communication evaluation.

The NAD should advocate, monitor, and support employment for deaf professionals in all school/institutions of, for, serving the deaf. The state associations should monitor, report, and get involved in advocating hiring of more deaf professionals. This is only a partial list of bills, motions, resolutions that were brought up at the NAD Convention. Since there is a lack of space and at least limited reading time before reaching the point of saturation, there will be more in an additional report on the convention in the next issue. David Mortensen (George Gavros) moved to have the copy of the minutes of 1985 UAD Convention to be on the table and have all the members to read the minutes later and act on them. Passed.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**Institutional Council** - Dennis Platt (Chairman of the Board/Vice-President) presented his updated report. There is a monthly meeting every second Tuesday of the month at 4:30 pm at the State Board of Education Building on 250 E. 500 S. (Salt Lake City).

**Interpreter Director & United Way** - David Mortensen stated that he became the director in February 1986. He has made progress.

**Utah Deaf School** - Roy Cochran explained about the education for the deaf children at the deaf school.

Recess was taken at 10:30 am; the convention reconvened at 10:45 am.

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT:**

Treasurer Nellie Sausedo presented financial reports from April 1, 1985 to March 31, 1987 on all funds (United Way of Greater Salt Lake, United Way of Northern Utah and the UAD general fund.) Valerie Platt, UAD bookkeeper, assisted Nellie Sausedo in answering questions from the floor. All financial reports were passed.

**Section 4:** Fees paid at or immediately prior to the convention shall apply to that convention. Any fees paid shall be good for the next following biennium to the beginning of but not including the next convention. Passed.

Lunch break was taken at 12:00 noon; the convention resumed at 1:30 pm.

The Board shall appoint successors from the list of candidates who failed to be elected to the Board during the convention. The candidate with the highest number of votes shall be considered first, then the others in order. The Chairman of the Board of Directors shall write to such candidates to inquire as to their availability and request answers in writing. Passed.

**#8 Proposals from the 1985 UAD Convention which were referred to the Law Committee.**

**Section 1:**

The Association shall be governed by a Board of Directors, eleven (11) in number, nine of the Board members to be elected biennially at each convention for a term of two (2) years or until their successors shall be duly elected and qualified. The nine (9) Board of Directors shall appoint from among themselves a President, a Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Chairman of the Board of Directors as executive officers. (The Chairman of the Board may also hold the office of Vice-President but no other executive office.) Within two months after being sworn into office, the nine (9) Board members shall define, recruit and swear into office, two (2) young people with strong influence on the young generation for a term of (2) years or until their successors shall be duly elected and qualified. A quorum of the Board of Directors shall be seven (7) of the Directors and as such as shall be authorized to determine the policies of the Association and to transact the business of the Association. Failed.

A. Candidates for the Board of Directors may be nominated from the floor and by names submitted from the election committee. Candidates who know they will be absent and want to run for the Board, shall have their nomination acceptance personally signed. Such candidates shall be active and life members in good standing.

The motion was made in 1985 Convention. The motion was passed but should have been referred to the Law Committee to be placed in the constitution. The motion was moved by David Samuelson seconded by Lloyd Perkins.

Valerie Platt, the chairperson of the Resolutions Committee. The two others on the committee were Dora Laramie and Priscilla Burdett.

6. Commendation to Tim Funk for his guidance in the legislature with regard to the TDD distribution and relay service bill.

7. Congratulations to Robert Welsh on receiving the Amos Kendall Award from Gallaudet University Alumni Association.
8. Thanks to United Way for generosity in allocating a sum of money each year for interpreting services.
9. Thanks to 1985-1987 board of directors and board of trustees members who served for Utah Association for the Deaf.
10. Commendation to NAD Convention committee members for the successful conclusion of the NAD Convention on behalf of the Utah Association for the Deaf.
11. Commendation to Ron Nelson and his convention committee for the planning of the 1987 UAD Convention.
12. Commendation to Miss Deaf Utah officers for their dedication to the pageant.
13. Commendation to Senator Darrel Renstrom and Representative Ronald Stephens for seeing the legislative bill through the Senate and the House for TDD distribution and relay service.
14. Commendation to those who gave time to attend a rally at the Utah State Capitol to push the legislative bill through.
15. Commendation to Thomas Bannister, superintendent of the Utah Schools for the Deaf and the Blind, for his willingness to work with deaf adults as a resource for the Utah School for the Deaf.
16. Commendation to the UAD Bulletin staff for their time, energy and effort in putting out a monthly issue of the UAD Bulletin.
17. Commendation to the Utah Board of Education for its generosity in allowing the use of the Utah Community Center for the Deaf by deaf people.

21. Express extreme disappointment to the State Superintendent of Public Education and the Director of Division of Rehabilitation in the lack of cooperation shown by the present state office of education deaf/hearing impaired specialist.

##### **#3 - Motion:**

In the event a director is absent three (3) straight Board of Directors meetings without an excuse of absence, he/she shall automatically be dismissed and successor shall be appointed accordingly.

Amendment was made to change from "dismissed" to "replaced". The amendment was passed. The main motion was passed as amended.

Section 1: The board shall appoint successors from the list of candidates who failed to be elected to the Board during the convention. The candidate with the highest number of votes shall be considered first, then the others in order. The Chairman of the Board of Directors shall write to such candidates to inquire as to their availability and request answers in writing.

It was moved to revise part of the section to change to "the Chairman of the Board of Directors shall contact such candidates as to their interest in serving on the board." Passed.
