Is this clear to you? Me - Nah! You can contact FCC to make your complaints. In 2006, there will be 100% full captions on every station so you will feel good to watch every program show with closed caption (CC). I hope all TV stations will show their message clearly without any scrambled words. If not so, you have a right to make your complaint to FCC by law.

Would you be interested to get a carbon monoxide detector in your house from the Fire Department? Carbon Monoxide is very dangerous and can kill you while you are living in a house and you can't smell it. A few Fire Departments in other states (Kansas and Maryland) have provided carbon monoxide detectors to deaf people in their furnace room at no cost. We might check with the Utah Fire Department if it is possible to provide for us in Utah. We will notify you soon with updates.

## Utah Legislature and Advocacy, Part III

(Excerpted from *Seven Keys for Effective Legislative Advocacy* by Dennis M. Byars)

There are suggestions of don'ts and dos when advocating with your policy maker:

### DO the following things:

- \* Make sure your legislator knows people with hearing loss and their families
- \* Contact your legislator early; make an appointment (do that before the legislation session begins in January!)
- \* Talk to your legislator in person in preference to telephoning or writing
- \* Establish on on-going relationship and a reputation for reliability.
- \* Treat your legislator as a friend and an intelligent citizen
- \* Be prepared. Be specific and know your facts
- \* Provide a brief, clearly written summary of your position (Check with Marilyn Call or Utah Association for the Deaf for position papers)
- \* Work with the legislator's staff! They provide your legislator with constituent information and...when a legislator does not have the time to become an expert on every issue, a staff member is relied on to research and suggest opinions on certain subjects.
- \* Leave simple written material
- \* Request specific action. Have reasonable priorities; compromise, it is a long process.
- \* Write a thank-you note following every visit or supportive action taken by your legislator.

### DONT do the following things:

- \* Try to talk to a legislator when they're obviously in a hurry
- \* Be argumentative or abrasive

- \* Overload them with written material
- \* Assume they are familiar with your issues
- \* Bluff if you don't know the answer
- \* Talk about too many issues at once
- \* Press for an answer from your legislator on your first visit
- \* Threaten a legislator with votes
- \* Spend association funds in any political campaign.

### Utah's Deaf High School Athletes Allowed to Compete in Sports

Utah's deaf and blind high school athletes will now have teams to call their own, the Utah High School Activities Association decided Thursday afternoon.

The UHSAA's Board of Trustees approved an application from the Utah School for the Deaf and Blind to begin competing in six sports in Class 1-A in the 2006-07 school year.

The USDB is re-joining the association, having been a member through the 1987-88 school year. It will compete in junior varsity contests its first year (in Region 17), before taking on a full varsity slate. The school has campuses in Ogden, Salt Lake County and Orem, and could possibly draw athletes from all three for its teams, which will be based in the Salt Lake Valley.

Deaf and blind students the past 17 years have been eligible to compete for the high school teams in the boundaries in which they reside, but few have been able to make the teams, school officials told the board, which voted unanimously.

New captioning regulations went into effect on Sunday, January 1. In general, 100 percent of new programs must be closed captioned. However, there are several loopholes. New networks, for example, are exempt during their first four years in operation.

Programs between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. are not required to be captioned, nor are TV commercials, locally produced instructional programs or public service announcements of less than 10 minutes. ABC, CBS, NBC, Fox and their affiliates must real-time caption their news programs in the top 25 television markets. If the new rules are violated, consumers may send complaints to the TV station or cable/satellite company. If no response is received after 45 days, a complaint may be filed with the FCC.
